The Austin History Center card catalog supplements the Austin Public Library Bibliocommons On-Line Library Catalog by providing analytical entries to information in periodicals and other materials in addition to listing individual items in the collection with entries under author, title, and subject. These tools lead to specific articles and other information in sources that would otherwise be very difficult to find.

It must be noted that there are still significant gaps remaining in our collection regarding the Latino/a/e/x American community. Please see the final section of this guide, "Under-documented Areas of Interest," for a detailed listing of topics about which additional material is still needed. In 1926 it became the Allan Junior High School and it was destroyed by fire in 1956. One of the documents now in the collection concerns The Battle of San Jacinto viewed from both an American and Mexican standpoint. By 1973, the Austin, Texas chapter of the Brown Berets had been established, and at its height included 20 registered members. Firefighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Records</p> <p>The Austin City Council voted to adopt a Civil Service law in 1948 and created the first Firemen's and Policemen's Civil Service Commission (as it was called then) on May 6, 1948 for the purpose of administering standardized tests for hiring and promotion and enabling police officers and firefighters to appeal disciplinary action to an independent commission. The collection contains meeting agendas, meeting minutes and support "backup" materials that document the Commission's activities from the first Commission meeting in 1948 to 2009. Starting in the 1970s there are discussions about the lack of African American and Mexican Americans applying to take, and passing, the entrance exams and possible solutions. Parks and Recreation Board Records</p> <p>The Austin City Council first authorized the Parks and Recreation Board (then named the Parks and Public Playgrounds Commission) via a 1928 ordinance that stated that the commission was to "act in an advisory capacity to the City Council and the City Manager in the acquirement, development, improvement and equipment of all parks, public playgrounds and boulevards owned or controlled by the City of Austin. The collection consists of administrative materials from the Parks and Recreation Board: (1) meeting minutes from 1928 to 1941, 1951 to 1993, and 2006 to 2007; (2) agendas and accompanying material (including meeting minutes) from 1976, 1985 to 1987, and 2006 to 2007; and (3) annual reports from 1999 to 2007. Another significant part of the collections consists of PARD Minute Journals and include Minutes of the Parks & Public Playgrounds Commission, June 1928 – September 1941, Minutes of the PARD Board 1951 – December 1990, and Minutes of the Austin Arts Commission 1975 – 1995. Barrientos Mexican American Cultural Center (ESB-MACC) is dedicated to the preservation, creation, presentation, and promotion of the cultural arts of Mexican Americans and Latino cultures. This unprocessed collection is 14.50 linear feet and consists of budgets, program information, reports, meeting minutes, videos, and more. Requires advanced notice.</p>
AR.V.003	<p>Austin Alliance for Smooth Transition Records</p> <p>The Austin Alliance for Smooth Transition (AAST) was organized in 1976, at the urging of the League of Women Voters of Austin, as a group of concerned individual and organizations to discuss how Austin, Texas could prevent the impending desegregation order from being the divisive and disruptive issue that it had been in other cities. AAST believed that public understanding and acceptance of a complex and difficult issue could be best fostered through timely and accurate information. The original principal activities were listed as: make accurate information available; generate resources from community groups to assist desegregation; encourage voluntary participation of interested citizens, parents, and students; provide a</p>

	<p>Speakers Bureau for groups who request information; coordinate activities of groups in the desegregation field; involve students in get-acquainted programs for new students; research and develop Fact Sheets on desegregation topics; and provide training workshops for facilitators. The first meeting was held on June 15, 1976 and was attended by over 40 members and more than 15 community groups. The group decided to have three co-presidents; one African American, one Mexican American and one Caucasian. By January 1977 the organization reported a "tri-ethnic membership of some 150 individuals and representative of organizations...." Series I: Austin Equal Citizenship Corporation (AECC) which contains the AECC administrative history, meeting agendas and minutes, correspondence, newspaper clippings and notes dating from 1964 to 1967 and Series II: Human Relation Commission (HRC) which is composed principally of materials related to the City of Austin's attempt to pass a Fair Housing Ordinance in 1967 and 1968. 	<p>The Austin Light was a bilingual English/Spanish newspaper published in Austin, Texas, between 1980 and 1990. The collection includes correspondence, creative works, printed material, and photographs that document the newspaper's publications and general business throughout its history. Included are election results and literature from 1987 to 1991 as well as poll results from Travis and Williamson Counties dating from 1985 and 1986.
