BRIEF OVERVIEW OF City Council District 2

In 2013, Proposition 3 passed, which changed Austin City Council from a seven member, at-large group to an eleven member, districted body. District 2 largely consists of Southeast Austin, and a small section of South Austin south of West Stassney Lane and east of Manchaca Road.

Communities and subdivisions in District 2 include Franklin Park, McKinney, Dove Springs, Nuckols Crossing, and Del Valle. Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (which is on the site of the now non-existent Bergstrom Air Force Base) and McKinney Falls State Park comprise sizable areas of District 2. Additionally, this subject guide includes information about communities that are adjacent and historically linked to District 2, including Pilot Knob, Moore’s Crossing, Bluff Springs and Garfield.

ARCHITECTURAL ARCHIVES COLLECTION

The Architectural Archives Collection contains drawings and renderings produced by local architectural firms and individuals donated to or acquired by the Austin History Center.

Eugene Wukasch, born in Austin, Texas in 1921, graduated from The University of Texas with a degree in architecture (B.S.Ar.E) in 1943. After working with several architectural firms he established his own practice 1953 which would eventually become Wukasch & Associates, AIA, PE, Architect and Consultants. The collection contains extensive project files and architectural drawings for Austin/Travis County projects as well as a limited amount of office files and materials related to Wukasch's involvement with several Austin/Travis County civic organizations dating from 1926 to 1995.</p> <p>Wukasch & Associates worked on numerous projects at Bergstrom Air Force Base from 1965-1983, including the squadron operations building, security police facility, chapel center, reconnaissance support facility, rocket checkout assembly and storage, parachute and dinghy shop, and flight simulator.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>

The records include correspondence, reports, legal documents, financial records, radio broadcast scripts, and Teacher Daily Registers dating from 1874 to 1952. AR.V.006	Mary Starr Barkley Papers, 1836-1981 Correspondence, notes, printed material, photographs, creative works, and scrapbook material (1836-1977, undated) document the life and work of Mary Starr Barkley, Texas historian, author, genealogist and volunteer. Mary Starr Barkley wrote predominantly about Austin and surrounding communities, and the collection includes information about Southeast Austin and Travis County, including McKinney Falls.

Sally Shipman Records, 1971-1990 Sally Shipman was first elected to the Austin City Council, Place 3, in 1983, was reelected in 1985 and 1987, and completed her tenure in the spring of 1990. Correspondence, memoranda, reports, budget documents, legal records, news clippings, maps and requests for assistance from Austin citizens

	<p>in this collection represent the work of Sally Shipman as Austin City Council member from 1983 through 1990. Shipman worked on many environmental and social issues that affected areas that are now part of District 2, in addition to Municipal Utility Developments (MUDs) that are now part of District 2 or adjacent to it.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>
AR.1992.010	<p>Ulit Family Papers, 1889-1969</p> <p>The Ulit family emigrated from Germany to Texas in the mid-1800s. These records date from the late 1800s to 1969 and consist of certificates, scrapbooks, letters, photographs, clippings, financial material, and memorabilia that document various Ulit family members' lives in Austin, Texas. Jo Ulit (1920-) was a volunteer at Bergstrom Air Force Base (originally called Del Valle Air Force Base, Bergstrom Field) during World War II.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>

AR.1996.008	<p>Appraisal Associates of Austin Records, 1953-1973</p> <p>Appraisal Associates of Austin was an Austin, Texas, real-estate appraisal and consultant business. The collection contains real-estate appraisals on individual Austin properties, as well as several urban-renewal projects dating from the early 1950s to the early 1970s. Aviation Department Records, 1941-2002</p> <p>This collection documents the last major expansion of the Robert Mueller Municipal Airport passenger terminal and the planning, construction, and opening of Austin-Bergstrom International Airport. The collection consists of photographs and other media, drawings, correspondence, press releases, and newspaper clippings, as well as meeting agendas and minutes of the Austin City Council's Aviation Subcommittee and Council work sessions.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>

	<p>The Bergstrom-Austin Community Council (BACC) served as a link between the Bergstrom Air Force Base personnel and the Austin community by planning programming and events. Since the closure of the Base, the organization has worked to maintain the history of the Base. More than 600 black-and-white and color photographs, scrapbooks, clippings, and assorted manuscript materials document the people and activities at Bergstrom Air Force Base from the 1940s through the 1990s when the Base was converted into the Austin municipal airport.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>
<p>AR.2000.025</p>	<p>Travis County (Tex.). Negro Extension Service Photograph Collection, 1940-1964</p> <p>As part of the Cooperative Extension Program, the Travis County Negro Extension Service served as the communication link between Prairie View A&M and Travis County black residents. In the early years of the agency, programming through Prairie View included only Farm and Home Demonstrations; 4-H Clubs, the youth program of the Extension Service, were established at the turn of the 20th century out of a need to improve life in rural areas by demonstrating to youth the latest in agricultural technology. The collection consists of 600 black and white and color photographs that document the activities of the Travis County Negro Extension Service, including participants from Pilot Knob and Del Valle.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>
<p>AR.2002.017</p>	<p>Texas Extended School and Community Health Education Program Records</p> <p>The Texas Extended School and Community Health Education Program began upon the invitation of the W. K. Kellogg Foundation in the mid-1940s and was the joint responsibility of University of Texas's Division of Extension and Department of Physical Education. The purpose of the program was to provide in-service and pre-service training to teachers in public health education with the intention of improving public health overall in selected communities. Travis County schools were among its participants, including Colorado, Pilot Knob, and Pleasant Valley Schools.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>
<p>AR.2003.007</p>	<p>Central East Austin Community Organization, Inc. Records, 1994-2003</p> <p>Central East Austin Community Organization, Inc. (CEACO) was established in the mid-1970s in Austin, Texas to promote self-development, safety, health and self-sufficiency for low income and at-risk children, youth, and adults through basic needs assistance, workforce development support services, health education and youth development programs in Travis County, with a</p>

	<p>primary focus in East Austin. The collection contains Board of Directors, administrative, marketing, financial, organizational and program records that highlight the activities of the organization from 1994 until its closing in the early 2000s.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>

AR.2004.023	<p>United South Austin Records, 1982-1988</p> <p>United South Austin (Texas) was an umbrella group whose membership was open to legitimate neighborhood and business associations, civic clubs and other community groups based in the area south of the Colorado River. United South Austin worked on matters of community, business and neighborhood concern. The majority of the collection consists of meeting minutes and agendas for the monthly meetings dating from 1982-1986, bylaws, and a proposed budget for 1984-1985.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>
AR.2005.015	<p>Austin (Tex.). City Council. Jackie Goodman Records, 1990-2005</p> <p>Jackie Goodman was an Austin City Council (Texas) member elected at-large for seat 3 in 1993. The majority of the collection consists of memoranda, correspondence, proposals, studies, and reports detailing the activities from her four terms in office. Austin Airport Advisory Commission Records, 1994-2008</p> <p>The Austin Airport Advisory Commission (AAAC) reviews and makes recommendations to the City Council on aviation projects that the Department of Aviation proposes for the capital improvements program, proposed aviation grants, aviation contracts, annual operating budget and quality of services at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (ABIA). The meeting agendas and minutes, recommendations for council actions, Director's Reports, aviation activity sheets, financial records and other back-up materials in this collection document the activities of the AAAC from July 1995 to December 2008.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>
AR.2012.015	<p>PODER Records, 1972-2012</p> <p>Founded in 1991 by a group of Chicana/o East Austin activists and community leaders, PODER (People Organized in Defense of the Earth and her Resources) seeks to redefine environmental, economic and social justice issues as basic human rights. The collection consists of correspondence and administrative records, reports, newspaper clippings, event fliers, grant proposals, video and audio recordings, radio programs, oral history interviews, and other documentation relating to PODER and their mission dating from 1972 to 2012, including information relating to the close of the Holly Power Plant, the Tank Farm shut down, BFI Recycling Center relocation and other environmental accomplishments.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>

<p>AR.2013.033</p>	<p>FAB-100 Records, 1939-2010</p> <p>The FAB-100 was a group of Chinese officers who served as interpreters in the U.S. during World War II. <p>AR.2016.007</p>	<p>Caleb V. Littlepage Papers</p> <p>Littlepage was an inventor and farmer living in the Del Valle area. The collection includes Civil War era correspondence from Caleb to his wife, medical paperwork documenting that he was not fit for service, and 2 U. S. patents that include a countersign and seal from the Confederate Patent Office.</p>
<p>AR.2017.024</p>	<p>Citizens for Airport Relocation and Airport Neighborhoods Environmental Defense Association Records, 1987-1998</p> <p>Expanding or relocating the municipal airport was a highly contested issue during the 1980s and 1990s in Austin, Texas. Citizens for Airport Relocation</p>

	<p>(CARE) and Airport Neighborhoods Environmental Defense Association (ANEDA) formed during this time period to advocate for moving the airport to Manor, Texas. Bylaws, membership lists, meeting minutes, newsletters that include meeting agendas, internal memorandum, financial records, legal documents, reports, newspaper clippings, handbills, and fliers highlight the activities of both organizations from 1987 to 1998.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on Texas Archival Resources Online.</p>

Garza, Delia	Mayor Pro Tem (2019) and District 2 Council Member (2015-). One of the first Mexican-American female firefighters in the Austin Fire Department before running for city council.
Givens, William Mortimer	Proprietor of a general merchandise store in Del Valle and Del Valle's first postmaster, a position he held for many years.
McKinney, Thomas Freeman, 1801-1873 (T)	Established a ranch outside Austin in 1850, which is now McKinney Falls State Park.
Neal, Edward	Superintendent of Del Valle ISD from 1971-1997.
