The Austin History Center card catalog supplements the Austin Public Library Bibliocommons On-Line Library Catalog by providing analytical entries to information in periodicals and other materials in addition to listing individual items in the collection with entries under author, title, and subject. These tools lead to specific articles and other information in sources that would otherwise be very difficult to find.

It must be noted that there are still significant gaps remaining in our collection regarding the Latino/a/e/x American community. Please see the final section of this guide, "Under-documented Areas of Interest," for a detailed listing of topics about which additional material is still needed.
