BRIEF OVERVIEW OF PARKS AND RECREATION

Under Austin's first form of government a Mayor and group of Alderman were elected to govern the city. Alderman exercised a variety of powers in this early form of government. Without the infrastructure and organization that characterizes city agencies today many duties for overseeing the welfare of Austin's citizens and the administration of city affairs fell upon the alderman. While first and foremost this was a legislative body who's time was primarily dedicated toward the consideration and passing of ordinances, their responsibilities also included managing municipal services like streets, water and sewer, construction, citizen protection, health care, etc... Through the formation of standing committees made up of two or three alderman appointed by the mayor, the council was able to handle the business of city government. Each alderman usually served on several committees at once. Predecessor's to the departments that handle the administrative work of the city today can be found even here.

The earliest example of the precursor to what we now know as the Parks and Recreation Department can be found in 1887 when Alderman J.M. Odell and Radcliff Platt are found to be serving on the Parks Committee. This committee and the various members who served as part of it can continue to be found through 1908 when a change in the city's government structure to that of a Commission style led to changes in its organization.

While the original form of government had established alderman as the legislative body and given the mayor power as the chief administrator and head of the administrative officers of the city, the commission combined the legislative and administrative duties under a single body. The elected commissioners, with the mayor, served as the council as well as individually serving as administrative heads of the city's departments. The departments they would lead were also laid out in the new charter.

- 1. The Department of Public Affairs
- 2. The Department of Receipts, Disbursements and Accounts
- 3. The Department of Parks and Public Property
- 4. The Department of Streets and Public Improvements
- 5. The Department of Police and Public Safety

Individually the commissioners and mayor each operated as the administrative head of one of these departments while collectively they met as the legislative body, the city council.

The first commissioner of the new Department of Parks and Public Property was Eugene C. Bartholomew. He appears to have served in this position while on the council until 1919, with W.L. Eyers perhaps taking over. While this structure persisted until another change in governmental organization in 1926 the department disappears from listings in 1924.

Seeking new leadership and organization of the city's government, prominent citizens again campaigned for change in the 1920s. Put to election in 1924 the citizens passed a charter that would reshape Austin's government as a Council Manager, also called a City Manager, form. The structure of the Council-Manager is a stark contrast to the Commission style. While the Commission had made no organizational distinction between the policy making and the administrative functions of government, Council-Manager attempted to remove the council from administrative duties by instead placing those duties under the stewardship of a City Manager. Organization of the administration of the city's services included the creation of multiple departments that reported to the City Manager. A Parks Department was not included in this initial organization. The Austin Parks and Recreation Department (originally called the Austin Recreation Department) was not established until May 1928 with James A. Garrison as the Superintendent. An advisory board was also established in this time period with W.T. Caswell as chair. More than 139,000 participants enjoyed programs in less than a year's time of Recreation Division operation.

Beverly Sheffield was appointed the director in 1946 and served in that position until 1973. While the first 45 years of the Parks Department only had 2 directors the next 36 years have seen men and women such as Jack Robinson, Leonard Ehrler, Jr., Charles Jordan, Manuel Mollidedo, Mike Heitz, Jesus Olivares, Warren Struss and Sarah L. Hensley lead the department.

The year 1875 marked the first gift of land to the City of Austin with specific direction that it be used as a park. Governor E.M. Pease donated 23 acres of land around Shoal Creek known as Pease Park. A jewel of the park system, Barton Springs and 35 acres surrounding it was deeded to the City in 1918 by A.J. Zilker.

By 1932, park acreage had increased to 594 acres and included Parque Zaragoza, Rosewood, and 300 additional acres in Zilker Park. By the end of the 1930s, a 1,006 acre park was being constructed on Lake Austin, now known as Emma Long Metropolitan Park. During this decade, programs were operated at 12 playgrounds, Lions Golf Course became a facility of the Department and performances at Zilker Hillside began. The number of pools grew from two to eight and included Rosewood, Stacy, Palm and Shipe.

The scope of the work overseen by Austin's Parks and Recreation Department has grown significantly since its founding. In addition to the vast amounts of acreage in public space that the Department manages in parks, preserves, creeks, canyons, and hike-and-bike trails can be added the responsibilities of oversight for recreation centers, activity centers, swimming pools, golf courses, museums, and water recreation spaces.
