VOTERS APPROVE 2012 BOND PROPOSITION

In November 2012, voters approved six of the City of Austin bond propositions totaling nearly \$307 million. As part of the development of the bond propositions in the year leading up to the election, a citizen Bond Election Advisory Task Force, City Council and the Community set expectations for the types of projects and programs to be delivered upon voter approval.

- Supports the maintenance of existing City infrastructure and facilities
- Make investments in new initiatives that reflect the priorities of the Imagine Austin Comprehensive Plan
- NO increase in property tax rate
- Implement projects city-wide

- **Proposition 17: Health and Human Services** **\$11,148,000**
- **Proposition 18: Library, Museum & Cultural Arts Facilities** **\$13,442,000**




KALWALL SKYLIGHTS

Kalwall panels control heat transfer and allow for natural daylighting by using materials that allow full spectrum visible light to transmit evenly and without glare.



FUTURE EXPANSION

STRATEGIC MASTER PLAN

- **OAK HILL SITE RECOMMENDED AS 1 OF 4 RESOURCE LIBRARIES**
- **EXISTING 8,580 SF INCREASED TO 30,000 SF**
- **PUBLIC WORKS ESTIMATED COST: \$16M (preliminary estimate)**

RESOURCE LIBRARIES

...shall be approximately 30,000 SF each located in each quadrant of the City to bridge and support existing branch libraries. Resource Libraries will augment public services and will serve as administrative and staff support centers, linking clusters of branches in each area of the City. These facilities will provide expanded collections, additional services and meeting room spaces for the public. In addition, the Resource library facilities will provide workspace for staff in the areas of reference, youth services and information technology.

BOOKMOBILE



The new bookmobile will offer wi-fi, computers, holds and a small collection of books. Services will be offered during the branches closure.


