## BRIEF OVERVIEW OF City Council District 4

In 2013, Proposition 3 passed, which changed Austin City Council from a seven member, at-large group to an eleven member, districted body. District 4 stretches from 51<sup>st</sup> Street north with Cameron and Dessau Roads as the eastern border, Highway 183 and Metric Blvd on the west, and Braker Lane to the north. North Lamar Boulevard is the main thoroughfare of the district. District 4 includes neighborhoods such as Georgian Acres, Heritage Hills, Delwood, Windsor Hills, parts of North Loop and Windsor Park, and the Highland and St. John's areas. Major points of interest include the Chinatown Center, Highland Mall, St. John's Orphan Home, Bartholomew Park, and Gethsemane Lutheran Church.

## ARCHITECTURAL ARCHIVES COLLECTION

The Architectural Archives Collection contains drawings and renderings produced by local architectural firms and individuals donated to or acquired by the Austin History Center.

<b>AR.2009.014</b>	<b>Fehr &amp; Granger and Emerson Fehr Drawings and Records</b>  Fehr & Granger was an Austin, Texas architectural firm founded by Arthur Fehr and Charles Granger, Jr. in 1946 and was active in the central Texas area until 1972.  <b>This collection includes project files and drawings for Lanier High School and Reilly Elementary School as well as St. John's Episcopal Church.</b>  A guide to the collection is available on <a href="#">Texas Archival Resources Online</a> .
<b>AR.2009.023</b>	<b>Rex D. Kitchens Construction Co. Records and Drawings</b>  The collection documents the activities of Rex D. Kitchens Construction Co. which specialized in commercial and industrial building in Austin, Texas between the 1930s and the 1990s. The company was founded by Rex Kitchens, a lifelong Travis County resident. The collection consists of 107 sets of drawings and a limited amount of specifications and project manuals.  <b>This collection several sets of drawings from the company's work on Highland Mall and stores within the mall. <p><b>AR.2009.041</b></p>	<p><b>Charles Coatsworth Pinkney Drawings and Records</b></p> <p>Charles Coatsworth Pinkney was a landscape artist that practiced in Austin, Texas from 1939 until his death in 1994. The landscape architecture drawings in this collection were created between 1938-1994 and represent residential, commercial, medical, ecclesiastical, educational, public, and military projects, with the focus on residential design. In addition, the project files include plant lists, smaller scale designs and invoices dating from 1942 to 1992.</p> <p><b>Charles Coatsworth Pinkney designed the landscape for the residences of both Bascom and Rogan Giles, the developers of the Delwood neighborhood. Those drawings as well as the landscape assessment for the Delwood No. 3 development are included in this collection. Drawings of the landscape design for Gethsemane Lutheran Church, and drawings for the Messiah Lutheran Church built in 1957 on Cameron Road are also in this collection.</b></p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on <a href="#">Texas Archival Resources Online</a>.</p>
<p><b>AR.2009.042</b></p>	<p><b>Wukasch &amp; Associates Records and Drawings</b></p> <p>J. Eugene Wukasch, born in Austin, Texas in 1921, graduated from The University of Texas with a degree in architecture (B.S.Ar.E) in 1943. After working with several architectural firms he established his own practice 1953 which would eventually become Wukasch &amp; Associates, AIA, PE, Architect and Consultants. The collection contains extensive project files and architectural drawings for Austin/Travis County projects as well as a limited amount of office files and materials related to Wukasch's involvement with several Austin/Travis County civic organizations dating from 1926 to 1995.</p> <p><b>This collection contains extensive documentation, photographs, publicity materials, and drawings from Wukasch's work on Gethsemane Lutheran Church, built in 1963 in addition to the Messiah Lutheran Church built in 1957.</b></p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on <a href="#">Texas Archival Resources Online</a>.</p>
<p><b>AR.2009.043</b></p>	<p><b>August Watkins Harris Records</b></p> <p>August Watkins Harris worked as an architect based out of Austin, Texas from the 1920s through the 1950s. As a partner in Giesecke &amp; Harris, and as an independent architect, he designed residential, educational, commercial, public, office and ecclesiastical buildings throughout Texas.</p> <p><b>This collection contains the drawings for the Settlement Home, 1952.</b></p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on <a href="#">Texas Archival Resources Online</a>.</p>

<b>AR.2013.011</b>	<b>Arthur Fehr Papers and Drawings</b>  Arthur Fehr was an Austin, Texas architect that practiced in the central Texas area from 1929 until his death in 1969. The collection contains architectural drawings by Fehr before he established a partnership with Charles Granger post-World War II.  <b>This collection contains drawings for Reilly Elementary School.</b>  A guide to the collection is available on <a href="#">Texas Archival Resources Online</a> .

<b>AR.F.004</b>	<b>Calcasieu Lumber Company Records</b>  Calcasieu Lumber Company started as a lumberyard in 1883 and evolved into a complete home center and furniture maker in its 117 years in business in Austin, Texas. The Board of Directors meeting minutes, financial records, legal documents, correspondence, publicity and marketing materials, personnel records, and photographs in this collection highlight the activities of the organization from 1882 to 1967. The Calcasieu Lumber Company Building was located at 6701 North Lamar Blvd in District 4.
<b>AR.J.005</b>	<b>Travis County Schools Superintendent Records</b>

	<p>The Travis County School Superintendent Office was created in 1887 and acted as the administrative head of the Travis County Common School Districts. The records include correspondence, reports, legal documents, financial records, radio broadcast scripts, and Teacher Daily Registers dating from 1874 to 1952. <p><b>AR.1994.045</b></p>	<p><b>Katherine Cook Scrapbooks and Photographs</b></p> <p>This collection of scrapbooks and photographs capture the work and life of Katherine A. Cook, beloved Austin music teacher and principle of Wooldridge School. Cook Elementary in District 4 was named in her honor.</p> <p>This collection is currently unprocessed but can be accessed in our Reading Room.</p>
<p><b>AR.1994.081</b></p>	<p><b>Travis County Historical Commission Records</b></p> <p>The Travis County Historical Commission (TCHC) was started in 1963 as enabled by the Texas Legislature, with the goal of preserving the history of Travis County and continues this mission to the present. Records include documentation on historical markers for the Zimmerman Home and project research on Fiskville, both located in District 4.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on <a href="#">Texas Archival Resources Online</a>.</p>
<p><b>AR.2000.016</b></p>	<p><b>Austin Seen Photograph Exhibition Collection</b></p> <p>The "Austin Seen" photography exhibition took place in 1984 at the Austin History Center. The contest was conceived as a way to encourage documentation of "our rapidly vanishing recent heritage." This collection includes 368 original photographs, including 5 of the Delwood neighborhood taken by photographer Wendel A. <p><b>AR.2002.017</b></p>	<p><b>Texas Extended School and Community Health Education Program Records</b></p> <p>The Texas Extended School and Community Health Education Program began in the mid-1940's and was the joint responsibility of University of Texas's (UT) Division of Extension and Department of Physical Education. The purpose of the program was to provide in-service and pre-service training to teachers in public health education with the intention of improving</p>

	<p>public health overall in selected communities. Travis County schools were among its participants, including District 4's Fiskville School. Photographs document the program and students participating at school and at home.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on <a href="#">Texas Archival Resources Online</a>.</p>
<b>AR.2004.021</b>	<p><b>Austin Film Society Records</b></p> <p>Text materials, posters, programs/fliers, and marketing materials documenting the work of the Austin Film Society whose cinema is in District 4.</p> <p>This collection is currently unprocessed but can be accessed in our Reading Room.</p>
<b>AR.2009.048</b>	<p><b>“Vietnam to Austin: Restoring Community” Exhibit Collection</b></p> <p>District 4 has served as a cultural hub for Austin’s Vietnamese community, which the largest Asian American population in Austin from the 1980s to 2000s. This collection includes photos and documents from Vietnamese American individuals and organizations that were collected for the <i>Vietnam to Austin: Restoring Community</i> exhibit in 2009.</p> <p>A guide to the collection is available on <a href="#">Texas Archival Resources Online</a>.</p>
<b>AR.2014.036</b>	<p><b>Bill Kennedy Neighborhoods: Looking at Austin in 1986 Exhibition Collection</b></p> <p>"Neighborhoods: Looking at Austin in 1986" was a workshop and exhibition organized by Bill Kennedy at St. Edward's University, where Kennedy was a photography professor. 90 11x14" black-and-white and color photographs by six local photographers document various neighborhoods in Austin, Texas in 1985-1986. <b>AR.2015.004</b>	<p><b>Greater Austin Asian Chamber of Commerce Records</b></p> <p>Though their offices are in District 1, District 4 is home to a large Asian American community and Asian American-owned businesses whom the Greater Austin Asian Chamber of Commerce serves. Photographs, clippings, business documents, and publicity materials document the activities of the organization.</p> <p>This collection is currently unprocessed but can be accessed in our Reading Room.</p>

## AUSTIN FILES – BIOGRAPHY: TEXT AND PHOTOGRAPHS

The Austin Files – Biography contain clippings, photos, and ephemera about Austin and Travis County residents who have contributed to the community.

Barrington, Mollie

School teacher for whom Barrington Elementary is named who worked with Austin Public School for 40 years. Barrington began her teaching career in Austin in 1927 at Palm School as a teacher of spelling and handwriting. In 1938, she was appointed citywide assistant coordinator for those subjects. She was considered one of the state's outstanding specialists in the teaching of both handwriting and reading.

Cook, Katherine Ann

Well-known Austin music teacher who also served as principal of the original Wooldridge School. Cook Elementary School, built in District 4 in 1974 was named in her honor.

Fisk, Josiah

Pioneer settler who founded Fiskville in the 1870s on Little Walnut Creek and old U.S. Highway 81 (North Lamar Blvd.). Fiskville had a population between 150

and 200 and an infrastructure in place that included a general store, school, church, and post office. Fiskville was annexed to Austin in the mid-1960s.

Fontaine, Jacob

In 1867, after emancipation, Reverend Jacob Fontaine founded six churches in Central Texas and helped to organize the St. John Missionary Baptist Association which ran St. John’s Orphan Home.

Garcia, Gustavo L.

Austin’s first elected Latinx mayor who also served on the Human Rights Commission, Austin School Board, Austin City Council, and then as Mayor of Austin. Throughout his career, he worked to bring issues of equity and environmental justice to the forefront of Austin government. Gustavo “Gus” Garcia Recreational Center in District 4 is named for him.

Giles, James Bascom

Texas Land Commissioner from 1939 to 1955. He and his brother acquired the Delwood area in the 1920s. The two brothers developed affordable houses and duplexes in addition to the Delwood Shopping Center in 1951.

Payton, Bradford Norman

Owner and operator of a cotton gin on what is now Payton Gin Road.

Rutland, Willie B.

Curator of the Elisabet Ney Museum for 38 years. She retired in 1967 and Austin Mayor Harry proclaimed June 28 as Willie Rutland Day in her honor. Rutland Drive runs through District 4.

<b>712 East Huntland Drive (P)</b> The current site of the AT&T Corporate Offices. The structure was built in 1973
<b>1200 Mearns Meadow Boulevard (T)</b> Current site of Armor Apartments located in District 4
<b>6701 North Lamar Boulevard (P)</b> Former site of the Calcasieu Lumber Company Building.
<b>9019 Parkfield Drive (T P)</b> Site of the Edward Zimmerman House. Built in 1854, this <i>fachwerk</i> style home is one of the oldest structures in the city of Austin. The home was first settled by early pioneers in the 1870s and was granted historic zoning by City Council in 1985.
<b>1010 Rundberg Lane (T)</b> District 4 Condominium Building for mixed commercial use
<b>Rutherford Lane (T)</b> Western portion of Rutherford Lane is in District 4
<b>1201, 1203 and 1205 Rutland Drive (T)</b> District 4 Apartment building complex
<b>1630 Rutland Drive (T)</b> Formerly Greenwoods Apartments, now known as Meadow's Edge Apartments in District 4.
